You can start from step 11 if you do not want IE to use HTTP-Tunnel.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Open Outlook Express 2. Open the Tools Menu, Click Options 3. Select the Connections tab <input type="checkbox"/> 4. Click the Change button on the Internet Connection Settings 5. Click the LAN Settings button on the Internet Properties Connections tab <input type="checkbox"/> 6. Mark the checkbox for 'Use a proxy server for your LAN' and 'Bypass proxy server for local addresses' <input type="checkbox"/> 7. Enter the following: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Address: localhost b. Port: 1080 |

8. Click OK to close the Local Area Network (LAN) Settings screen

9. Click OK to close the Internet Properties screen

10. Click OK to close the Outlook Express Options screen.

11. Select Tools Menu, Click Accounts



12. Click on the Mail tab

13. Click the Add button, select Mail

14. Enter your email Display Name



15. Click Next

16. Enter your email address



17. Click Next

18. Enter localhost for both the Incoming mail and Outgoing mail server



19. Click Next

20. Enter you account name and password for your mailbox



21. Click Next



22. Click Finish to close the Wizard

23. Click Properties button



24. Click the Advanced tab

25. Slide the Server Timeouts to 5 minutes



26. Click OK to close the Properties screen

27. Click Close to close the Internet Accounts screen

28. Open HTTP-Tunnel

29. Open Settings Menu, select Add Ports/Applications



30. Enter your mailbox's incoming mail port (usually 110 for POP3)

31. Enter your incoming mail server



32. Click Add

33. Enter your mailbox's outgoing mail port (usually port 25 for SMTP)

Note: SMTP is not currently supported due to spam abuse in the past

34. Enter your outgoing mail server



35. Click Add

36. Click OK to close the Add Applications/Ports screen
